

PIPE CLEANER SPIDER

Materials:

- X4 Black pipe-cleaners (X1 spare pipe-cleaner)
- X2 Googly eyes
- X1 pom pom (*note pom poms vary in colour*)

Materials required (not provided):

- Craft glue

Steps:

1. Align the four pipe-cleaners together and bend them in half.
2. Twist them together in the middle to create a loop (approximately 2-3cm) for the spider's body.
3. Twist this a couple times to make sure the pipe-cleaners are secure.
4. Place each of the 8 legs through the body loop created in step 2.
5. Bend the legs into a bend position and place it on a flat surface. If a leg is too long you can shorten it by putting it again through the body loop.
6. Stick the two google eyes on to the pom pom.
7. Using glue, stick the pom pom onto the body of the spider.
8. All done!

PUMPKIN SUNCATCHER

Materials included:

- X1 Orange paper with template (X1 spare orange paper)
- X 1 Black paper strip with template (X1 spare black paper strip)
- X1 Orange tissue paper sheet (X2 spare tissue paper)
- X2 Clear contact papers

Materials required (not provided):

- Scissors

Steps:

1. Using scissors cut out the outside of the pumpkin outline.
2. Cut out the middle of the pumpkin outline. This will create a border.
3. With the black paper strip, cut out the pumpkin face part – 1X mouth, 2X triangles for eyes, 1X small triangle for nose.
4. Peel the backing of one contact paper and place on the pumpkin outline on the contact paper.
5. Place the pumpkin face parts down on the contact paper and set aside.
6. Cut small random shapes out of the tissue paper, approximately 2X2cm would be best.
7. Stick the small shapes you have cut out from the tissue paper all over the contact paper. Make sure to cover the entire contact paper section of the pumpkin.
8. Cover the entire pumpkin with the second piece of contact paper.
9. Cut the contact paper around the edge of the pumpkin shape.
10. Hang it up on a window!
