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In 2005, an old kindergarten, in the almost island-like neighbourhood of Notting Hill, narrowly missed being turned into a row of townhouses.

Saved from its demolition-destined fate by a group of parents, who were resolute in their mission to preserve the village atmosphere of the locality, Notting Hill Neighbourhood House (NHNH) has been an integral part of the neighbourhood over the last decade. From a small office, run by volunteers, we have evolved into a slightly larger team with access to a multipurpose centre. We provide a range of classes, activities and events as well as a safe playground and space for our neighbours to connect, play and learn together.

NHNH caters to people of all ages and backgrounds - we hope to engage with our neighbours and create a space that effectively supports the neighbours of Notting Hill as well as the wider community in Monash.

TREASURER'S REPORT

NHNH incurred an operating surplus of \$16,712.03 in 2019-2020 (FY2020), an increase compared to the previous year's performance which resulted in a surplus of \$14,199.41 for 2018-2019 (FY2019).

Total income for the Financial Year 2020 is **\$142,053.74**

Primarily driven by:

- Grants: \$91,093.54
 - State Gov NHCP \$83,033.44
 - Monash Operational \$7,529.71 and
 - Other grants \$530.59
- Hall Hire: \$13,637
 Generated by leasing NHNH hall to various groups and individuals
- Class Fees: \$4,612.86
 Generated through various activities, and classes run by NHNH
- Fundraising: \$873.24
 Raised through various events organized by NHNH
- JobKeeper Program: \$31,500.00
 Australian federal government wage subsidy allocated to businesses affected by the COVID-19 global pandemic

Overall income increase in FY2020 compared to FY2019 is primarily driven by:

- JobKeeper program \$31,500.00.
- Real income for FY2020 is down by
 -\$15,158.74 against all other revenue
 line items compared to FY2019 due
 to the stringent lockdown measures
 implemented because of the
 COVID-19 pandemic.

Total Operating Expenses for FY2020 are up by **\$23,828.64** compared to FY2019. Primarily driven by:

- Lower overall general expenses \$5,504.79
- Higher Payroll Expenses \$29,329.12
- Additional Staff Allowances Paid (First Aid) \$1,230.75
- Portable Long Service Leave Increase \$1,388.84
- JobKeeper Attributable Wage Payments \$26,709.53

Net wage top-up amounts for eligible staff offset from Federal funding received





Total Assets closing balance for FY2020 was **\$76,825.93** compared to the closing balance of \$58,459.04 for FY2019 (an increase of \$18,366.89).

Key drivers for the increase in this position are:

- Increased Bank Balances of \$8,522.15
- Federal Government Wage Subsidy Payments of \$10,812.52
- Full depreciated Fixed Assets of (\$967.76)



NHNH's Net Financial Position shows a significantly higher closing Total Equity value for FY2020 of \$63,357.45 compared to the closing FY2019 figure of \$46,645.45 (an increase of \$16,712.03).

The NHNH Committee of Management would like to extend its thanks and gratitude to all of the staff, volunteers, helpers and associates who have worked tirelessly over the last financial year (and continue to do so), to ensure the continued success and stability of the house, in the wake of many challenges and difficult times during 2020.




CODING FOR KIDS (ON SCRATCH)
